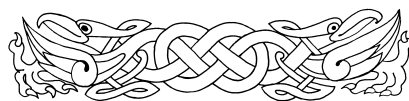

# IRELAND'S SACRED LANDSCAPE: A STUDY/TOUR IN CELTIC MYTH AND LEGEND

Kilkenny & Southeast Ireland April 14-21, 2007

**T**his coming Spring, the New York center for Jungian Studies is pleased to offer its annual study/tour devoted to “Ireland’s Sacred Landscape.” Limited to 32 participants, this unique program is an in-depth exploration of the relationship between Ireland’s landscape and the myths that emanated from the land. The hills, mountains and landscape of Ireland, along with its villages, ancient tombs, forts and monasteries, are dramatic indicators of the always fascinating and powerful archetypes present in the mythology of this land.

Our 2007 study/tour will be based in Kilkenny. Steeped in history, bearing the marks of Celtic, Viking, Norman and English invaders, it has been a market town since at least the fourth century and was for a time the ecclesiastical and political center of Ireland. Kilkenny’s winding, cobbled streets, medieval castles and churches and carefully restored shop-fronts and craft studios give it a unique atmosphere—unlike any other town in Ireland.

Led by Jungian analyst *Aryeh Maidenbaum*, accompanying faculty include internationally acclaimed Irish singer, theologian and musicologist *Noirin Ni Riain*, and Irish Jungian analyst *Jim Fitzgerald*. Additionally, we are fortunate to once again have with us guest scholar *Michael Gibbons*—who will lead us on our field trips in Kilkenny and the Southeast of Ireland. Providing an ongoing narrative, Michael will magically weave his vast knowledge of the area’s sacred sites and stunning scenery with stories of Ireland’s history, people and her culture.

## ***Tentative Daily Schedule\****

### **SATURDAY, APRIL 14**

For those in need of ground transportation from Dublin airport, board luxury coach for drive to Lyrath Estates. En-route, rest stop and time for lunch in Kilkenny before proceeding to the Lyrath—one of Ireland’s finest hotels. With a 17th century Manor House an integral part of the hotel, the Lyrath Estates, situated on over 170 acres of scenic land, is a five minute drive from Kilkenny and an ideal base for our study/tour. Check into the Lyrath; rest and relax before Introductions, Orientation and Welcoming Dinner.♣

### **SUNDAY, APRIL 15**

Following the first of seven hearty Irish breakfasts, we will begin with a morning study session. Our week’s inspiration will start with **Noirin Ni Riain** presenting “*Anail De—The Breath of God in Ireland’s Myth, Legend, Song and Story*” and **Jim Fitzgerald** on “*Being and Becoming: The Otherworld Journey*.” Our afternoon will be free to meander on the grounds and/or explore Kilkenny on our own. In the evening, we will return to meet **Michael Gibbons**, one of Ireland’s leading archaeologists who will introduce us to the landscape of Ireland with his wit and wonderful slides as he speaks about “*Saints, Sinners and Sorcerers: Mythic and Religious Landscapes in Ancient Ireland*.”

# STUDY/TOUR continued...

## MONDAY, APRIL 16

Today, we will explore Kilkenny, steeped in history and atmosphere. Our walking tour will include visits to Saint Canus' Cathedral and the Medieval Church of Saint Mary's (both of which contain a rich array of early Christian and Medieval Sculpture) and Rothe House (one of the best preserved Medieval Houses in Ireland and home to one of the country's earliest archaeological societies). Following lunch on our own in Kilkenny, we will continue our walk, including a guided tour of Kilkenny Castle, which dominates the town itself and is one of the finest Medieval Castles in the country. Evening study session with **Jim Fitzgerald**, "*Transit of the Soul: Borders and Boundaries.*"

## TUESDAY, APRIL 17

Led by **Michael Gibbons**, we will travel from Kilkenny, via Kildare, to the exceptionally stunning monastic valley of Glendalough (the Sacred Valley of Saint Kevin). Located deep in the Wicklow mountains, Glendalough, valley of the two lakes, is a magical setting containing within it one of the best preserved monastic sites in Ireland. Its peace and tranquility attracted St. Kevin, a descendent of the Royal House of Leinster, who retreated there to fast and pray in solitude. At Glendalough, we will visit the main monastic complex and exquisitely sited Reefert Church which overlooks the upper lake. En-route we will have lunch❖ and visit Moone Abbey—containing one of the most beautiful High Crosses in Ireland.

## WEDNESDAY, APRIL 18

We will begin with a presentation by **Noirin Ni Riain**, "*Hearing the Sound of the Divine in the Irish Language and Imagination,*" and continue the day with **Michael Gibbons** as we journey south from Kilkenny and drive through a wonderful series of Medieval towns and villages—including Thomastown (formerly a medieval walled town) and Inistioge, with its picturesque stone bridge and small 18th and 19th century houses. Our return journey will take us through one of the largest Neolithic tombs in Ireland (a large portal dolmen) and the incredible walled abbey of Kells Priory with its seven miniature castles. We will have lunch❖ en-route.

## THURSDAY, APRIL 19

**Michael Gibbons** will again lead us as we head south to Fethard (a wonderfully preserved walled medieval town surrounded by lush farmland) and, after lunch,❖ proceed onward to the Rock of Cashel—seat of the ancient chieftans and, later, the Kings of Munster. A "spectacular mirage of fairytale turrets and crenellations," legend has it that the Rock of Cashel was created when the devil, flying over the site with a huge rock in his mouth, spotted St. Patrick, dropped the rock and inspired St. Patrick to found a new church here. It is also said, that it is in this place where St. Patrick first picked a shamrock, in order to explain the doctrine of the Trinity. During the course of our visit, we will see Cormac's Chapel, one of the most outstanding examples of Romanesque architecture in the country.

## FRIDAY, APRIL 20

Today, our last full day in Ireland, we will have a final study session with **Jim Fitzgerald** on "*The Union of Opposites: Lovers and Kings,*" and **Noirin Ni Riain**, on "*Ireland's Sacred Song*" as well as the opportunity to share our thoughts and feelings about what we have learned and experienced during the week. Our afternoon will be free for personal excursions, rest, relaxation and/or last minute shopping. In the evening, we will enjoy a festive, farewell dinner❖ with traditional Irish music performed by local Irish musicians.

**R**ich in natural beauty, Kilkenny is a county of gentle hills and lush agricultural land—bordered by the Barrow, Nore and Suir rivers. Our hotel, the Lyrath Estates, is nestled among 170 acres of beautiful parkland and exquisite countryside and is only a five minute drive from Kilkenny city—known as the medieval capital of Ireland. One of Ireland's best preserved medieval towns, it contains a huge array of early Christian monuments, medieval castles and streetscapes and is situated in the "Sunny Southeast," one of the warmest and driest corners of Ireland.

Built around a traditional 17th Century Manor House, the five star, deluxe Lyrath Estates is one of Ireland's finest hotels with scenic views of the surrounding, fertile farmland and rolling hills nearby. # 2007 JUNG IN IRELAND FACULTY

**Jan Bauer, M.A.**, earned her M.A. degrees in literature at the Sorbonne and Adult Education at Boston University. A graduate of the Jung Institute, Zürich, she lives in Quebec where she practices as a Jungian Analyst (in both French and English); teaches throughout the U.S. and Canada and lectures at the University of Montreal. Former Chair of Admissions and Director of Training for the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts, her publications include *Alcoholism and Women* and *Impossible Love*.

**Maureen Concannon, Ph.D.**, is a psychologist educated in the U.S. and at University College and Trinity College, Dublin—where she has lived for over fifty years. She is a Registered Member of the Psychological Association of Ireland and the American Psychological Association. Dr. Concannon has taught courses in Jungian psychology at University College, Dublin and is in private practice in Dublin. Her publications include two histories of Irish clans, a history and psychology of the *Sheela na Gíg: The Sacred Whore*, and “Sheela Cards: A Tool for Transformation.”

**Guy Corneau, M.A.**, Jungian analyst, is internationally recognized for his work on issues of masculine identity, the challenges couples face around intimacy issues and on the meaning of crisis and illness. A popular and influential presence in the Canadian media, (hosting a weekly TV show, “Guy Corneau, en-toute confiance”) his publications include *Absent Fathers, Lost Sons; Lessons in Love: The Transformation of Spirit Through Intimacy; Healing the Heart: Making Sense of Suffering; and Victims of Others or Victimizers of Oneself?*

**Wendy Doniger, Ph.D.**, is Mircea Eliade Distinguished Service Professor of the History of Religions at the University of Chicago. She received her Ph.D. in Sanskrit and Indian studies from Harvard and her D.Phil in Oriental Studies from Oxford. 2003 Barry Ulanov Memorial Lecturer, Dr. Doniger’s research and courses in mythology address themes that occur across cultures. Among her many books are *Hindu Myths: A Sourcebook*, (translated from the Sanskrit); *The Rig Veda: An Anthology*, *The Bedtrick: Tales of Sex and Masquerade* and *The Woman Who Pretended To Be Who She Was*.

**Jim Fitzgerald** is an Irish Jungian analyst who currently lives and practices in London. He received his Diploma in Analytical Psychology from the C.G. Jung Institute in Zürich and is a member of The Independent Group of Analytical Psychologists in the U.K. and of The Guild of Analytical Psychology and Spirituality. With a background in Ancient Classics, he is also a supervisor to trainees in Ireland; teaches courses in Jungian psychology and has lectured widely in Ireland, the U.K. and abroad.

**Michael Gibbons**, one of Ireland’s most respected archeologists, is highly acclaimed for his ongoing field work in Connemara—one of the most important archaeological areas in Ireland. A popular presenter on archaeology throughout Ireland, he has lectured worldwide, including Oxford, Cambridge and the National Geographic Society. Author of over twenty five articles and Reports, he is a Member of The Institute of Irish Archeologists, The Croagh Patrick Archeological Research Team and the Heritage Council of Ireland.

**Andrew Harvey** is a poet, writer, teacher and mystic. He is a former fellow at All Souls College, Oxford, and has taught at Cornell University, Hobart College, the California Institute of Integral Studies and The New York Center for Jungian Studies’ “Jung On The Hudson” program. He is the author and editor of numerous books and articles, including *Hidden Journey; The Return of the Mother; A Journey in Ladakh; The Essential Mystics; The Son of Man*, and his latest book, *The Direct Path*.

**Thomas Patrick Lavin, Ph.D.**, is a Zürich trained Jungian analyst and licensed clinical psychologist in private practice in Wilmette, Illinois. He completed his training in both clinical psychology and theology at the University of Innsbruck in Austria and is a founding member of the C.G. Jung Institute of Chicago. Formerly chief psychologist in charge of drug and alcohol treatment for the U.S. Army in Europe, Dr. Lavin’s area of expertise is the interface of psychology, religion and spirituality. His 32 audio CD programs in the “psychology of religion” are available from the Chicago Jung Institute.

**Aryeh Maidenbaum, Ph.D.**, is a Jungian Analyst and Director of the N.Y. Center for Jungian Studies. Among his publications are “Psychological Types, Job Change and Personal Growth;” “The Search for Spirit in Jungian Psychology;” “Sounds of Silence;” *Lingering Shadows: Jungians, Freudians and Anti-Semitism*, and *Jung and the Shadow of Anti-Semitism*. Dr. Maidenbaum, who was on the faculty of NYU for over eighteen years, is also a contributing author to *Current Theories of Psychoanalysis*, Robert Langs, ed.

**Noírin Ní Riain, Ph.D.**, is an internationally acclaimed Irish singer who has performed worldwide. A theologian and musicologist with a Ph.D. in theology from the University of Limerick, her thesis subject was “Towards a Theology of Listening” for which she coined a new word ‘Theosony’—from Gr. Theos (God) and Latin sonans (sounding). Author of books and articles, she has entertained international visiting governmental guests on many occasions. Her most recent recording, which she both produced and directed, is “Biscantorat—Sound of the Spirit from Glenstal Abbey” and features Sinead O’Connor, the Monks of Glenstal Abbey and John O’ Donohue.

**Diana Rubin, L.C.S.W.**, is co-Director of the New York Center for Jungian Studies. Ms. Rubin was a staff psychotherapist at the Postgraduate Center for Mental Health’s Institute for the Performing Artist from 1992-1998. Currently, she is in private practice in New York City and New Paltz, New York, leads workshops and seminars on creativity and Mid-Life issues, and specializes in working with creative and performing artists in both individual and group therapy.
